b. Faizi: Translated the panchatantra, the Ramayana and the Mahabharata into Persian.

c. Todar Mal :The revenue minister of sher shah suri who continued in the position in the court of Akbar. He introduced standard weights and measurements, revenue districts and officers.

D .Abdul Raheem Khan-i-Khanan: The son of Akbar's general Bairam Khan, the person who looked after him after death of Humayun. Rahim is known for his couplets or dohe.

e. Tansen: A great musician who is credited with innovation of ragas such as Miran ki Malhar ,Mian ki Todi and Darbari Kanada.

✦In ancient times a gold coin was actually its value in weight. Today paper money has replaced the usage of coins for bigger denominations.


